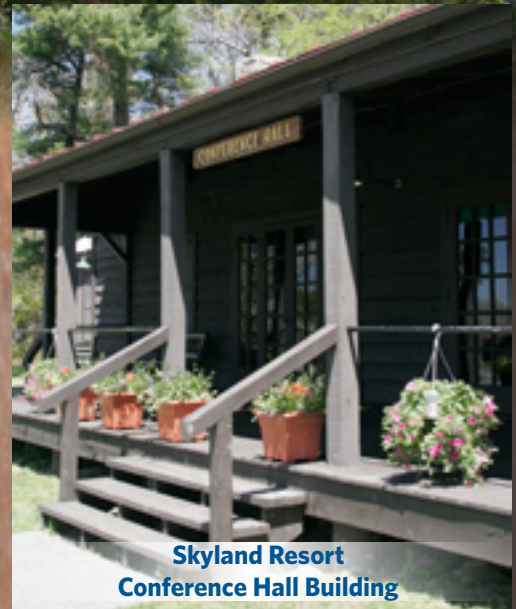
And you must save room for the Mile-High Blackberry Ice Cream Pie! A signature dessert in Shenandoah.
